

## **UNDERSTANDING THE EUROPEAN UNION (INSTITUTIONS, VALUES AND EU DECISION-MAKING FOR EDUCATORS) - 5 DAYS COURSE**

### **Introduction and Description**

This is an intensive professional development course designed to enhance educators' European literacy and their capacity to teach the European Union in a critical, engaging, and pedagogically meaningful way. As schools across Europe are increasingly expected to promote democratic values, active citizenship, and informed participation, teachers require not only factual knowledge about the EU, but also the pedagogical competence to translate complex political structures into accessible and relevant learning experiences for students of different ages.

The course offers a coherent introduction to the historical development of European integration, the foundational values underpinning the European project, and the institutional architecture through which the EU operates. Participants develop a clear understanding of how EU institutions function, how decisions are made, and how European policies influence national education systems and everyday school life. Particular attention is given to the relevance of EU citizenship, fundamental rights, mobility, and participation, emphasising how European governance intersects with young people's lived realities.

Beyond institutional knowledge, the programme places strong emphasis on critical EU literacy. Participants are encouraged to explore multiple perspectives, address misconceptions and Euroscepticism, and foster balanced, inquiry-based approaches rather than prescriptive narratives. The course supports educators in navigating sensitive topics such as democratic legitimacy, diversity of viewpoints, and the role of media and information in shaping perceptions of the EU.

Designed for teachers of social sciences, history, geography, citizenship education, and interdisciplinary subjects, the course also supports school leaders and Erasmus+ coordinators seeking to strengthen European dimensions within their institutions. By linking EU content to participatory pedagogies, project-based learning, and whole-school approaches, the programme empowers participants to embed European values, democratic practices, and institutional understanding into curricula, school culture, and international cooperation activities in a sustainable and context-sensitive manner.

### **Methodology and Assessment**

The course employs participatory, learner-centred, and experiential methodologies grounded in adult education and democratic education principles. Learning methods include interactive lectures, facilitated discussions, case studies, simulations of EU decision-making, collaborative workshops, and

reflective activities. Emphasis is placed on linking theoretical understanding with classroom practice and real-world school contexts.

Assessment is formative and process-oriented, focusing on active participation, collaborative engagement, and the development of practical outputs such as lesson plans, project ideas, or school-level action strategies. Peer feedback, guided reflection, and self-assessment are integral components. Learning outcomes are evaluated through participants' demonstrated ability to critically understand EU structures and apply this knowledge pedagogically, rather than through summative testing.

## **Learning Objectives**

### **1. EU Historical and Conceptual Foundations**

Participants will:

- Understand the historical context and key stages of European integration
- Analyse the political, social, and economic motivations behind EU cooperation
- Critically examine different narratives of Europe and European identity

### **2. EU Values, Rights and Citizenship**

Participants will:

- Identify core EU values and their legal and educational significance
- Understand EU citizenship, rights, and responsibilities
- Explore value-based education approaches suitable for diverse classrooms

### **3. Institutions and Decision-Making**

Participants will:

- Explain the roles and interactions of EU institutions
- Understand legislative procedures and decision-making mechanisms
- Analyse transparency, accountability, and democratic legitimacy

### **4. EU Policies and Everyday School Relevance**

Participants will:

- Examine EU policies affecting education, youth, digitalisation, inclusion, and sustainability
- Connect EU priorities to school-level initiatives and Erasmus+ projects

- Translate policy frameworks into meaningful learning experiences

## **5. Pedagogical Application and Democratic Practice**

Participants will:

- Design interdisciplinary and participatory EU-focused learning activities
- Foster critical thinking, debate, and student participation
- Develop action plans for integrating EU literacy into school culture

### **Preparation**

After registration participants will receive a pre-course questionnaire which will be used by the trainer to learn about participants' teaching backgrounds and to assess their exact needs. Before the beginning of the course a basic reading list will be suggested to participants to prepare for the training. Participants will also be asked to prepare a presentation about themselves, their professional context and their culture. The presentation will be presented on the first day of the course to facilitate networking opportunities. Participants will receive information about the country they are going to visit in order to prepare them for their cultural experience.

### **Follow up**

After the course participants will be asked to share what they have learned with the rest of the staff in their schools. Further books and articles to deepen the topic and contacts with some other practitioners all over Europe and in the world will be suggested by the trainer. The methods shared and explored and the bibliography given will allow the participants to complete and improve their educational path.

### **Certificate**

Certificate complies with the guidelines of the Erasmus+ programme and includes the topic, number of didactic hours, dates and location of the course. We can list the record of learning outcomes on the Europass Mobility Document on request of participants. In case a participant requires a specific format of certificate we can accommodate that if requested at least one week before the start of the course. It is necessary to attend at least 80% of the hours in order to receive the certificate.

### **Accommodation**

We do not directly offer accommodation and subsistence and participants are responsible for organizing it by themselves.

We also provide all the support with paperwork you might need for your Erasmus+ project documentation such as mobility agreement and registration letter.
