

EDUCATION FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT (ESD) IN PRACTICE (FROM GLOBAL GOALS TO CLASSROOM ACTION) **- 10 DAYS COURSE**

Introduction and Description

This is an advanced professional development programme designed to equip educators, school leaders, and adult education professionals with the theoretical foundations, pedagogical tools, and strategic competences required to embed sustainability meaningfully within educational systems. Anchored in internationally recognised frameworks for Education for Sustainable Development and informed by the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), the course responds to the growing expectation that education institutions actively contribute to sustainable, inclusive, and democratic societies.

The programme conceptualises ESD as a transformative and systemic approach to education that transcends disciplinary boundaries and traditional curriculum models. Participants critically explore sustainability as a multidimensional concept encompassing environmental integrity, social justice, economic responsibility, and ethical citizenship. Particular emphasis is placed on systems thinking as a core competence for understanding complexity, interdependence, and unintended consequences, enabling educators to move beyond fragmented or linear interpretations of global challenges.

A strong focus is placed on values-based education and the ethical dimensions of teaching and learning. Participants examine the role of education in shaping learners' values, attitudes, and identities, and consider how democratic participation, global responsibility, and intercultural understanding can be fostered through reflective and dialogic pedagogies. The course further highlights the importance of whole-school and organisational approaches, addressing leadership, governance, institutional culture, and strategic planning as key levers for sustainable change.

Through an integrated combination of theoretical input, collaborative inquiry, reflective practice, and applied project work, participants develop the capacity to translate global sustainability agendas into concrete classroom practices and institutional strategies. The course supports educators in positioning themselves as agents of change capable of initiating, leading, and sustaining Education for Sustainable Development initiatives across formal, non-formal, and adult learning contexts.

Methodology and Assessment

The course is based on experiential, participatory, and reflective learning methodologies consistent with adult education principles and Education for Sustainable Development frameworks. Learning activities include interactive lectures, collaborative workshops, systems-mapping exercises, case study analysis, reflective dialogue, and guided action-planning. Participants are encouraged to connect

global sustainability concepts with their own professional contexts through continuous reflection and peer exchange.

Assessment is formative and developmental, focusing on active participation, reflective learning journals, collaborative tasks, and the design of an individual or institutional ESD action plan. Peer feedback and facilitator guidance support critical reflection and practical application. The course emphasises learning for transformation rather than summative evaluation, ensuring relevance, transferability, and long-term impact.

Learning Objectives

Conceptual and Theoretical Understanding

Participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate an in-depth understanding of Education for Sustainable Development as a transformative educational paradigm grounded in international policy and research.
- Critically analyse the Sustainable Development Goals as an interconnected and systemic framework relevant to education systems and learning communities.

Systems Thinking and Interdisciplinary Practice

Participants will be able to:

- Apply systems thinking concepts and tools to interpret complex sustainability challenges in educational and societal contexts.
- Design interdisciplinary and cross-curricular learning experiences that reflect the interconnected nature of sustainability issues.

Pedagogical and Methodological Competence

Participants will be able to:

- Integrate learner-centred, participatory, and inquiry-based pedagogies aligned with ESD principles.
- Facilitate transformative learning processes that promote critical thinking, reflection, and learner agency.

Values-Based and Ethical Education

Participants will be able to:

- Embed ethical reasoning, democratic values, and global citizenship within teaching and learning practices.
- Address controversial and “wicked” sustainability issues through inclusive dialogue and critical reflection.

Whole-School and Organisational Development

Participants will be able to:

- Contribute to the design and implementation of whole-school or organisational strategies for Education for Sustainable Development.
- Apply leadership and change-management principles to support long-term sustainability initiatives.

Professional Reflection and Action

Participants will be able to:

- Reflect critically on their professional role and responsibility in fostering sustainable futures through education.
- Develop and present a classroom-based, institutional, or organisational ESD action plan aligned with their professional context.

Preparation

After registration participants will receive a pre-course questionnaire which will be used by the trainer to learn about participants’ teaching backgrounds and to assess their exact needs. Before the beginning of the course a basic reading list will be suggested to participants to prepare for the training. Participants will also be asked to prepare a presentation about themselves, their professional context and their culture. The presentation will be presented on the first day of the course to facilitate networking opportunities. Participants will receive information about the country they are going to visit in order to prepare them for their cultural experience.

Follow up

After the course participants will be asked to share what they have learned with the rest of the staff in their schools. Further books and articles to deepen the topic and contacts with some other practitioners all over Europe and in the world will be suggested by the trainer. The methods shared

and explored and the bibliography given will allow the participants to complete and improve their educational path.

Certificate

Certificate complies with the guidelines of the Erasmus+ programme and includes the topic, number of didactic hours, dates and location of the course. We can list the record of learning outcomes on the Europass Mobility Document on request of participants. In case a participant requires a specific format of certificate we can accommodate that if requested at least one week before the start of the course. It is necessary to attend at least 80% of the hours in order to receive the certificate.

Accommodation

We do not directly offer accommodation and subsistence and participants are responsible for organizing it by themselves.

We also provide all the support with paperwork you might need for your Erasmus+ project documentation such as mobility agreement and registration letter.
