

LESSONS FROM FINLAND WITH SCHOOL VISITS - 5 DAYS

COURSE

Introduction and Description

This 5-day course provides a condensed yet rigorous introduction to the Finnish education system through theoretical exploration, structured school visits, and guided pedagogical analysis. Participants examine key principles that underpin Finland's educational success, including equity-driven structures, trust-based professionalism, learner-centred pedagogy, restorative classroom management, and evidence-informed curriculum design. The programme integrates direct observation of Finnish schools with analytical tools that support critical interpretation of organisational practices, teaching approaches, and learning environments.

Participants develop a comparative understanding of how national educational cultures shape school life and identify elements of Finnish practice that can be meaningfully adapted to their own contexts. Through collaborative workshops, micro-teaching, reflective dialogue, and synthesis activities, they formulate actionable plans for pedagogical or organisational innovation. By the end of the course, participants will have a robust understanding of Finnish educational philosophy and practical strategies for translating its insights into context-appropriate improvements.

Methodology and Assessment

The course employs an integrated methodology combining expert input, case studies, structured school visits, collaborative workshops, outdoor experiential learning, and guided reflection. Participants engage in observation, dialogue with Finnish practitioners, micro-teaching tasks, and project-based learning. Emphasis is placed on linking theory with real-life practice and supporting participants in contextualising Finnish approaches within their own educational settings.

Assessment is continuous and formative, based on active participation, reflective journals, observation templates, group activities, and a final presentation of an implementation plan. Feedback focuses on pedagogical insight, reflective depth, and the practical applicability of proposed innovations.

Learning Objectives

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

Knowledge & Understanding

- Understand the structural organisation, curricular framework, and policy foundations of the Finnish education system.
- Analyse learner-centred and inquiry-based pedagogical approaches observed in Finnish classrooms.
- Examine Finnish approaches to classroom management, teacher autonomy, and student support systems.
- Identify formative assessment principles used to promote motivation, autonomy, and learning progression.

Skills & Competences

- Conduct structured classroom and school observations using analytical frameworks.
- Interpret and evaluate Finnish educational practices and synthesize insights for practical transferability.
- Design context-sensitive pedagogical actions inspired by Finnish approaches.
- Engage in reflective and collaborative professional dialogue to support pedagogical development.

Attitudes

- Develop openness toward diverse international educational models.
- Demonstrate motivation to adapt evidence-informed practices to local conditions.

Preparation

After registration participants will receive pre-course questionnaire which will be used by the trainer to learn about participants' teaching backgrounds and to assess their exact needs. Before the beginning of the course a basic reading list will be suggested to participants to prepare for the training. Participants will also be asked to prepare a presentation about themselves, their professional context and their culture. The presentation will be presented on the first day of the course to facilitate networking opportunities. Participants will receive information about the country they are going to visit in order to prepare them for their cultural experience.

Follow up

After the course participants will be asked to share what they have learned with the rest of the staff in their schools. Further books and articles to deepen the topic and contacts with some other practitioners all over Europe and in the world will be suggested by the trainer. The methods shared and explored and the bibliography given will allow the participants to complete and improve their educational path.

Certificate

Certificate complies with the guidelines of the Erasmus+ programme and includes the topic, number of didactic hours, dates and location of the course. We can list the record of learning outcomes on the Europass Mobility Document on request of participants. In case a participant requires a specific format of certificate we can accommodate that if requested at least one week before the start of the course. It is necessary to attend at least 80% of the hours in order to receive the certificate.

Accommodation

We do not directly offer accommodation and subsistence and participants are responsible for organizing it by themselves.

We also provide all the support with paperwork you might need for your Erasmus+ project documentation such as mobility agreement and registration letter.
