

LEARN ENGLISH THE FUN WAY: Advanced English for Teachers (B2–C1) - 10 DAYS COURSE

Introduction and Description

This advanced English language course is designed for in-service teachers and education professionals who already operate at an upper-intermediate to advanced level (B2–C1) and seek to further develop their communicative competence, linguistic accuracy, and professional fluency in English. The course responds to the growing need for confident, autonomous English users who can participate effectively in international cooperation, Erasmus+ mobility activities, professional exchanges, and multilingual school environments.

The programme adopts a learner-centred and practice-oriented approach, placing strong emphasis on meaningful communication, interaction, and real-life language use. Participants engage in a wide range of spoken, written, and multimodal tasks that reflect authentic professional contexts, including meetings, presentations, debates, collaborative problem-solving, and educational scenarios. Advanced grammar and vocabulary are revisited and expanded in context, enabling participants to refine precision, register awareness, and stylistic control rather than focusing on isolated rule-based learning.

A distinctive feature of the course is its integration of creativity, playfulness, and experiential learning into advanced language development. Through storytelling, role-play, improvisation, games, media-based tasks, and cultural exploration, participants strengthen fluency, spontaneity, and confidence while maintaining a high level of linguistic sophistication. Particular attention is given to pronunciation, intonation, pragmatic competence, and discourse strategies, supporting more natural and persuasive spoken English.

In addition to language development, the course explicitly addresses the professional needs of teachers. Participants explore how advanced English can be used effectively in classroom communication, international projects, professional documentation, and intercultural collaboration. Reflection, peer exchange, and collaborative task design allow participants to transfer newly acquired language skills directly into their teaching practice.

By the end of the course, participants will demonstrate increased accuracy, fluency, and confidence in English, alongside enhanced awareness of strategies for lifelong language development. The programme supports European priorities related to teacher mobility, multilingual competence, and quality education by empowering educators to engage more actively and creatively in international and multilingual educational contexts.

Methodology and Assessment

The course employs an interactive, communicative, and experiential methodology grounded in task-based learning and reflective practice. Language development is embedded in authentic communicative tasks, collaborative activities, creative challenges, and problem-solving scenarios relevant to teachers' professional contexts. Grammar and vocabulary are addressed inductively and functionally, with emphasis on meaningful use rather than mechanical practice. Peer interaction, discussion, and feedback are central to the learning process, fostering confidence and autonomy.

Assessment is formative and continuous, focusing on participation, task completion, self-reflection, and demonstrated progress in communicative competence. Participants engage in self-assessment, peer feedback, and portfolio-based reflection aligned with CEFR descriptors. The final sessions include integrative tasks and presentations that allow participants to demonstrate consolidated language skills and reflect on their learning outcomes.

Learning Objectives

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

1. Advanced Communicative Competence

- Communicate fluently, confidently, and spontaneously in complex professional and social situations
- Use discourse markers, hedging, emphasis, and reformulation strategies effectively

2. Linguistic Accuracy & Range

- Apply advanced grammatical structures accurately in spoken and written English
- Expand and refine vocabulary, including idiomatic language, collocations, and register-appropriate expressions

3. Pronunciation & Pragmatic Awareness

- Improve pronunciation, stress, rhythm, and intonation for natural and intelligible speech
- Interpret and use pragmatic features such as humour, irony, and implied meaning

4. Reading, Listening & Critical Engagement

- Understand and critically analyse authentic spoken and written texts
- Extract key information, recognise bias and tone, and respond analytically

5. Advanced Writing Skills

- Produce coherent, well-structured texts for formal, semi-formal, and reflective purposes

- Edit and revise texts using appropriate stylistic and grammatical conventions

6. Professional & Pedagogical Application

- Use English confidently in teaching-related contexts, international projects, and collaboration
- Design engaging, creative language activities suitable for advanced learners

7. Reflective & Autonomous Language Learning

- Monitor personal language development through reflection and self-assessment
- Identify strategies for continued improvement and lifelong language learning

Preparation

After registration participants will receive pre-course questionnaire which will be used by the trainer to learn about participants' teaching backgrounds and to assess their exact needs. Before the beginning of the course a basic reading list will be suggested to participants to prepare for the training. Participants will also be asked to prepare a presentation about themselves, their professional context and their culture. The presentation will be presented on the first day of the course to facilitate networking opportunities. Participants will receive information about the country they are going to visit in order to prepare them for their cultural experience.

Follow up

After the course participants will be asked to share what they have learned with the rest of the staff in their schools. Further books and articles to deepen the topic and contacts with some other practitioners all over Europe and in the world will be suggested by the trainer. The methods shared and explored and the bibliography given will allow the participants to complete and improve their educational path.

Certificate

Certificate complies with the guidelines of the Erasmus+ programme and includes the topic, number of didactic hours, dates and location of the course. We can list the record of learning outcomes on the Europass Mobility Document on request of participants. In case a participant requires a specific format of certificate we can accommodate that if requested at least one week before the start of the course. It is necessary to attend at least 80% of the hours in order to receive the certificate.

We do not directly offer accommodation and subsistence and participants are responsible for organizing it by themselves.
